Concession fees for forms 1300t and 1290

You are only eligible for a concession fee if you hold a valid Pensioner Concession Card issued by the Australian Government (Services Australia or the Department of Veterans' Affairs) and:

- you are listed as the primary cardholder; or
- you are aged 17 years or younger and are listed as a dependant; and
- the Pensioner Concession Card is not expired.

Health Care Cards, Student Cards or Senior Health Cards **cannot be used** to get a concession fee.

No fee is payable for children aged 15 years or younger applying on the same form as a responsible parent.

Provide a **copy of both sides** of your Pensioner Concession Card with your citizenship application.

If lodging a paper application, provide **certified copies** of both sides of your Pensioner Concession Card. See **immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/help-support/applying-online-or-on-paper/on-paper/certified-copy**

** Fee exemptions for forms 1300t and 1290

No fee is payable by:

- British and Maltese former child migrants who came to Australia without their parents between 22 September 1947 and 31 December 1967 under the Commonwealth Child Migration Scheme.
 - A letter from the Child Migrants Trust confirming details of your arrival and sponsorship must be lodged with your application.
- Persons who have served for a total of at least 90 days in the permanent forces of the Commonwealth of Australia.
 - A letter or discharge papers from the Australian Defence Force specifying service dates must be lodged with your application.
- Persons applying under Statelessness provision (section 21(8) of the *Australian Citizenship Act 2007*).

IMPORTANT: You cannot apply online if you want a fee exemption, you must use a paper application form.

- No fee is payable if:
 the application is to replace evidence of Australian citizenship that was lost, destroyed or damaged due to a natural disaster as listed on the Department of Home Affairs (the Department) website; and
- the application is made within 18 months of the date specified for the natural disaster on the list.

Fees are specified in the *Australian Citizenship Regulation 2016*. Fees are subject to change.

On 1 July each year, indexation will be applied to citizenship application fees based on the consumer price index.
