# Pregnancy health undertaking

Important – Please read this information carefully before you complete your pregnancy health undertaking. Once you have completed your pregnancy health undertaking we strongly advise that you keep a copy for your records.

## Who is required to sign a pregnancy health undertaking?

A pregnancy health undertaking is required for pregnant visa applicants who have not had the required chest x-ray.

## What is a pregnancy health undertaking for?

Tuberculosis is a serious infectious disease of public concern in Australia and a chest x-ray is the best screening tool for active tuberculosis.

You have been asked to sign a pregnancy health undertaking because you have not undergone a chest x-ray as part of the health examinations required for your visa application due to your pregnancy.

A pregnancy health undertaking is an agreement that is made with the Australian Government, which obliges you to undergo a chest x-ray at the Migration Medical Services Provider after the birth of your child.

By signing this pregnancy health undertaking you also agree to undergo any course of treatment or investigation that the health clinic directs.

**Important:** You must contact the Migration Medical Services Provider within 9 months of the grant of your visa and make an appointment.

## What do I do now?

Should you agree to abide by the pregnancy health undertaking, you should sign this form and return it to the Department of Home Affairs (the Department) office processing your visa application.

You will then be provided with a copy of this form.

**Please keep the copy as you will need it when you attend your appointment at the health clinic.**

## Where do I go?

The Migration Medical Services Provider will advise you which health clinic you should attend to undergo your chest x-ray in Australia. Once you contact the Migration Medical Services Provider your health information will be referred to that nominated health clinic.

## Costs

The cost of the chest x-ray is paid by you directly to the Migration Medical Services Provider.

## Why should I attend a health clinic?

It is in your best interests to comply with the requirements of your pregnancy health undertaking. The health examination is necessary to minimise the risk of spread of tuberculosis to close family, friends and the community. If the doctor thinks it is necessary, treatment for tuberculosis will be arranged.

Your co-operation with the pregnancy health undertaking is vital to assist the Australian Government to protect you, your family and the Australian community.

## Important information about privacy

Your personal information is protected by law, including the *Privacy Act 1988*. - (for applicants outside Australia) to inform the Australian Visa Office where I lodged my visa application if, before my departure, I change my proposed address in Australia or travelling times.
