# Pacific Engagement Visa (PEV) English Language Undertaking

Important – Please read this information carefully before you complete your PEV English Language Undertaking. Once you have completed your PEV English Language Undertaking we recommend that you keep a copy for your records.

## Who is required to sign a PEV English Language Undertaking?

PEV applicants must demonstrate that they meet minimum standards of English Language Proficiency. This is equivalent to IELTS 5.0 in speaking and listening testing components.

If you can demonstrate you meet the English language requirements for your visa application OR if you would like to complete an English language test, please disregard this form.

If you, or your spouse/defacto partner included in the application, are unable to demonstrate the required level of English, you may choose to complete a PEV English Language Undertaking.

## What is a PEV English Language Undertaking?

The PEV English Language Undertaking is an agreement that you make with the Australian Government to participate in the Adult Migrant English Program (AMEP) to improve your English language skills, if eligible. Learning English will help you to participate more fully in Australian life. You will learn new skills to help you work and make friends in Australia.

## What do I do now?

If you agree to participate in the AMEP if eligible, you should complete and sign the PEV English Language Undertaking and attach it to your visa application through ImmiAccount.

## What is the AMEP?

The AMEP provides free English language classes to eligible migrants and humanitarian entrants with low English levels to help you settle and participate in the Australian community.

The AMEP is delivered at around 300 locations across Australia, in major cities as well as in regional and remote areas.

It provides a range of flexible learning options to help you study, including full time, part-time, evening and weekend classes. It offers face-to-face classes, virtual classes, a volunteer tutor scheme and distance learning.
