This form must be completed for each member of the family unit aged 18 years or over **whether migrating or not**. If there is insufficient space to answer, provide details under 'Additional information' at the end of this form.

Life in Australia – Australian values

The Australian Government encourages people to gain an understanding of Australia, its people and their way of life, before applying for a visa to live in Australia.

This includes understanding that the English language, as the national language, is an important unifying element of Australian society. Australian society is also united through the following shared values:

- respect for the freedom and dignity of the individual;
- freedom of religion (including the freedom not to follow a particular religion), freedom of speech, and freedom of association;
- commitment to the rule of law, which means that all people are subject to the law and should obey it;
- parliamentary democracy whereby our laws are determined by parliaments elected by the people, those laws being paramount and overriding any other inconsistent religious or secular 'laws';
- equality of opportunity for all people, regardless of their gender, sexual orientation, age, disability, race, or national or ethnic origin;
- a 'fair go' for all that embraces:
 - mutual respect;
 - tolerance;
 - compassion for those in need; and
 - equality of opportunity for all.

If the member of the family unit is applying for a visa to migrate to Australia then they are encouraged to read the *Life in Australia* booklet before completing this application form. If they have difficulty, or are unable to read the booklet, they may have the content of it explained to them, for example, by a friend or relative. This form contains a statement, that they must sign, that confirms they understand and will undertake to conduct themselves in accordance with the values of Australian society (as explained in the booklet) and will obey the laws of Australia.

Members of the family unit who are seeking to be added to an existing application, which was lodged before 15 October 2007, may not need to sign the statement. If the member of the family unit has concerns about signing the statement then they, or the main visa applicant, should speak to their case officer.

Including family members in your application

In your visa application you will be asked for information about each member of your family unit (such as your partner or children) even if they do not intend to migrate with you. Information about which family members are considered to be a 'member of your family unit' for migration purposes is available by referring to form 1496i *Including family members in your application*. Form 1496i is available from the Department's website **www.homeaffairs.gov.au/about/corporate/information/forms** You should ensure that you read and understand form 1496i before completing this form.

Integrity of application

The Department is committed to maintaining the integrity of the visa and citizenship programmes. Please be aware that if you provide us with fraudulent documents or claims, this may result in processing delays and possibly your application being refused.
